- Travel Information:
Due to budget constraints, public transports should preferably be used (travel by bus will cost 3 € return trip). In exceptional cases (e.g. late arrival), travel by taxi will however be reimbursed. For further details, please see the map provided in [page 3](#).
 - **By train:** From Central Station, take city bus n° 18 (direction "Kirchberg", one bus every 10 minutes) to bus stop "Jean Monnet" (estimated travel duration: ca. 15 minutes).
 - **By plane:** From Findel Airport, take city bus n° 16 in front of the airport arrival hall (direction "Hesper – Cité Um Schlass", one bus every 10 minutes), to bus stop "Philharmonie/Mudam" (estimated travel duration: ca. 10 minutes). You then have to walk for about 10 minutes to Jean Monnet Building, 2 min to Novotel.
 - **By car:** The Jean Monnet building of the European Commission is located in the north of Luxembourg City. On the motorway A1 Luxembourg-Trier (Trevés), take exit "Kirchberg".

- **Dinners** will be offered on Tuesday, 27 March evening around 19:00 in the Sofitel Restaurant

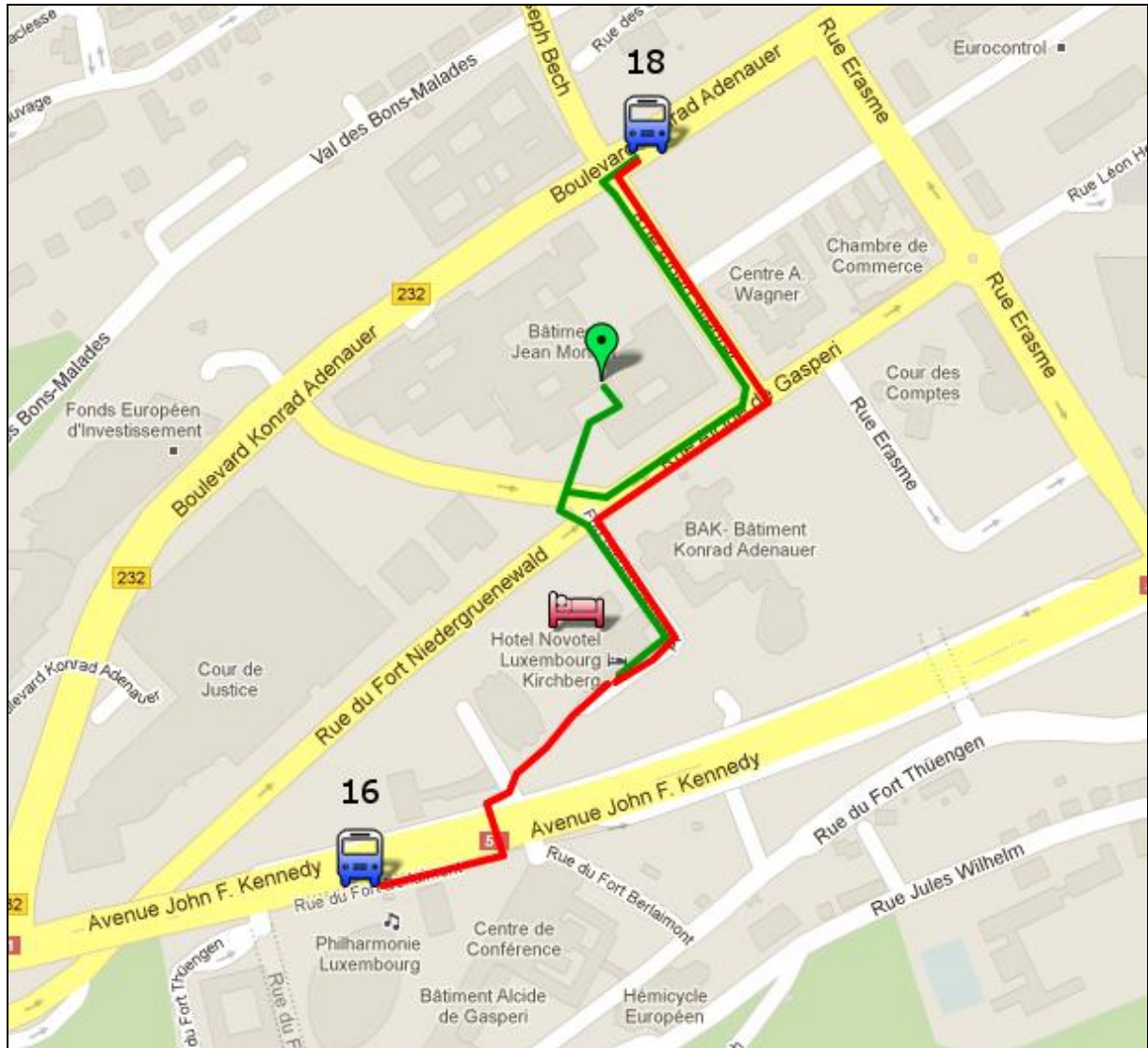

Subject: Invitation Letter to DwB First European Data Access Forum (EDAF)


As a representative of your institution, you are kindly invited to the *European Data Access Forum* organised within the framework of the FP7 *Data without Boundaries* project. The Forum will be held on 27 and 28 March 2012 in the “Jean Monnet” building of the European Commission, Luxembourg.

The EDAF will provide a unique opportunity for Data Archives, National statistical offices, other members of the European statistical system and the Research community to work together and find acceptable solutions to overcome the barriers to research using official data in the ERA. Working together in this project allows them to speak with confidence to other stakeholders such as the national data protection commissioners and research funding councils. The success of the Forum depends on the attendance of the different communities in equal proportion, reflecting the membership of the project

Through a series of presentations, business cases, working sessions and roundtables, the 1st European Data Access Forum will focus mainly on the legal frameworks and the research accreditation process for access to national microdata across boundaries. It will also be the opportunity to share information in the context of the ongoing revision of the European Commission Regulation (EC) N°831/2002 concerning access to confidential data for scientific purposes at the EU level.

Posters, demos and workshops will also offer the possibility to cover more broadly other important topics such as technical and methodological issues about remote access for confidential microdata and metadata standards. They may also give the opportunity for the participants to provide further information about their organisation and projects, making this event a European Forum for data producers, data providers and data users.
